## **1.3 CRITERIA WISE SUMMARY**

#### **Curricular Aspects**

Late Bapusaheb Ekambekar College Hanegaon is affiliated to Swami Ramanand Teerth Marathwada University, Nanded and the college strictly follows rules and regulation of the affiliating university. It prepares

academic calendar followed by the university academic calendar. The regular meetings are conducted by the principal to implement the defined curriculum by affiliating university. Teacher prepare teaching plan, they maintain daily dairy, they prepare notes and at the end of academic year, they submit the syllabus completion report. The college has skill based courses known as SEC prescribed by the affiliating university. Apart from it, the college runs certificate course in Hindi, Marathi, Political science approved by the college development committee. As per university prescribed syllabus, there project for annual pattern in the course of geography, economics and history. The college collects feedback on regular basis from many stakeholders as students, parents, alumni teachers etc. The college website. Thus, the college works for the welfare and overall development of students who are living in a very remote and tribe located area.

#### **Teaching-learning and Evaluation**

The college is affiliated to Swami Ramanand Teerth Marathwada, University, Nanded. The intake of student is 120 for the BA program run by the college. The demand ratio is 1:1. There are 20 teaching staff members including Principal. Out of 20, there are 13 fulltime permanent staffs. Almost 90 Percent staff is Ph.D holders means out of 13, 10 permenent faculties are PH.D holder. There are seven full time temporary teachers. Out of seven 2 are Ph.D holders. Total 16 students are pursuing Ph.D under these Guides and two are awarded. The college strictly follows rules and regulation of Reservation policy for admission and appointment both as per UGC norms, State Government Norms and affiliating university norms. There are more students from reservation earmarked as per policy and the college supports them for the benefits of scholarship. It works for the overall development and benefits of the students. 1: 9 is the teacher student ratio of the college so teachers can give individual attention of each student for their overall development. The college has defined COs, POs and SPOs for each subject and defined Cos, POs and SPOs are made available on the college website, in the library and in every department. The college has specific method of analyzing attainment level of Cos, POs and SPOs with using seven scale measurement tool and Blooms taxonomy. The internal and external assessment of the college is very transparent and where students have doubts, all subject teachers try to overcome it. Thus, all the stakeholders of the college work for the welfare and overall development of the students.

#### **Research, Innovations and Extension**

The funding of government is the major problems since 2012. There is no funding for project is provided by UGC or other agencies. The entire teaching staff member tried to publish their research work in reputed journals. The concept of UGC care is after 2019, July and the assessment period of the college is from 2017. Every subject teacher published their research work in the reputed journal for the said period. Two years of assessment period were the part of pandemic situation due to covid-19. During, these two year as the social enrichment activities, staff and students distributed masks in the nearby villages. They counseled the people about the importance of using mask and sanitizers as well as maintaining safe zone of distance. Apart from these two years, the college conducted several social extension activities under NSS as blood donation camp, voter awareness rely, participation in Swach Bharat Abhiyan etc. The college has conducted Covid-19 awareness program of central government guided by Jayshree Jain. The college has MoU with Fourth Dimension, Aurangabad. The college conducted workshop on Intellectual Property Rights delivered by Dr. C. S. Padmavat, Campus Director ICEEM. The college further organized one day workshop on Research Methodology. Miss Meghna Joshi CEO, Fourth Dimension was the Key note addresses of this workshop. Apart from it, the college has maintained Green campus and built proper ECO System. The college has displayed Boards and Banners with slogan explaining importance of Environment and Sustainability Development.

#### **Infrastructure and Learning Resources**

The college has adequate physical facilities for smooth running of teaching learning process. It has total 4 acres land out of which 2 acres is own land of the college and 2 acre land in on lease based. Total built up area is 9545.62 sq.feet excluding ground and gardening. Total ground area is 154824.13 sq feet which is used as the outdoor games. The notable thing is that this ground is made available for practice to outside college stakeholders too who are preparing for police and other departments job. The college tries to create healthy and pollution free environment, hence is it developed garden area 5595.20 Sq. Feet. Inside the campus road area is 2195.04, Sq. feet. There are total 21 rooms including office, Principal cabin, classrooms, laboratory as classroom 09, 1 Geography laboratory, 1 auditorium, open theatre, total department 08, library, office, Principal, NSS and Hindi, Girls Common room, library reading room, seminar hall, sport department, IQAC, examination hall etc. Timely internal and external audit is completed by the college. The Charted Accountant is appointed for the external audit. The college library has adequate facilities of text books and reference books. It has availability of e-books facilities. The timely accession registers are maintained by the librarian. Students are motivated to use maximum books from library. The college is located in rural area and in between three states of India i.e. Karnataka, Telengana and Maharashtra border in rural and remote located area. Yet, the college tries to provide maximum facilities including best books facilities in the library. The college is located in rural area and in between three states of India i.e. Karnataka, Telengana and Maharashtra border in rural and remote located area where there is very hard to get availability of wifi connectivity. The college tried to contact many agencies and companies for the availability of wifi facilities but due to interior part, they are not ready to install Wi-Fi facilities. Hence, college made the solution of using Dongle for internet facilities. Two dongles are available in the college for the internet facility. Those who needs internet connectivity for the purpose of teaching-learning process, they use dongles and personal mobile internet.

#### **Student Support and Progression**

Late Bapusaheb Patil Ekambekar College Hanegaon is affiliated to Swami Ramanand Teerth Marathwada University, Nanded. It is state university. The college statuary is University Grant Commission. Hence, for the scholarship, the college has to follow rules and regulation of University Grant Commission, state university and affiliating University. The numbers of students are more than earmarked students and the college supports them to get financial support for the further education. The college runs value added courses under SEC. The college has formed committee like women redressal Cell, ST Cell, SC Cell, OBC Cell, Anti Ragging Committee, Internal Compliant Committee, Examination Committee etc. All college committees work according to their requirement. The meeting registers are maintained by concern committees. The college has registered alumni association.

#### Governance, Leadership and Management

The college has set up its vision and mission with keeping its location which is in between three state borders as Karnataka, Telengana and Maharashtra. Students are from rural and poor economic background. To give them good education with providing proper and adequate facilities is the main motive of the parent institute and the college. The college has prepared strategic development plan and prospectus development plan with the support of the college development committee. The college believes in the decentralization of the work, authority and responsibilities. Accordingly, the committees are formed and the organogram of it is uploaded on the college website. The college believes in continues improvement policy. Hence, it conducts workshop, seminars and faculty development training programs for the staff in house as well as supports the staff to complete such profession development program as refresher, orientation and Short term course under the career advancement schemes. Timely Appraisal forms are filled by the staff.

#### **Institutional Values and Best Practices**

The college works with maintaining equal treatment and facilities for male and female both. All facilities are maintained for both male and female students and staff. The College works for overall development of the students with organizing co-curricular activities with the academic development as it celebrates all the national days, birth and death anniversary of great leaders and other important days. Sc. after 2009. The college is located in a very remote area and it is surrounded by three states border as Karnataka, Telangana and Maharashtra. Late Bapusaheb Patil Ekambekar College Hanegaon is affiliated to Swami Ramanand Teerth Marathwada University, Nanded. Hence, the planning and designing of the curriculum is the part of affiliating university while implementation is the part of college. The college has well established system to implement the defined curriculum by the affiliating university. The college formed Academic Development Committee which works to achieve the overall excellence in academic and other non-academic activities concern with the all rounded development of the students. Academic Development Committee conducts the meeting at the beginning of every academic year and discusses on the achievements of previous academic year. The Academic Development Committee plans the academic activities for the upcoming academic year such as preparation of Academic Calendar of the college, preparation of Academic Calendar of each department, preparation of time table, formation of several committees as prospectus preparation committee, result analysis/ mapping committee, timetable committee, ST Cell, SC cell, Ant ragging committee etc. To implement the curriculum defined by the affiliating university, every subject teacher prepares teaching plan and conducts the lectures accordingly. The daily dairy is maintained by ever teaching faculty with students' attendance.
